In addition, students are also recommended to have the following for their specific instrument:

#### FLUTE:

- ♦ Tuning Rod If not supplied with flute
- ♦ Polishing Cloth
- Silk Swab for cleaning the inside of the instrument

#### OBOES AND BASSOONS:

- Three working reeds at all times. Hand-made is preferred. See Mr. Wilson for reed information.
- ♦ Plastic Reed Case holds 3 or 4 reeds
- Cork Grease, Cleaning Swab & Cleaning Cloth
- ♦ 1 empty 35 mm film case or small bottle to soak reeds.

#### CLARINETS:

- ◆ Three Four working reeds (Vandoren) at all times. (NOTE: Reed Option on right column)
  - o 6th grade 2 ½ strength
  - o 7th/8th grade 3 3 1/2 strength
- ♦ Mouthpiece: Vandoren 5RV, Yamaha 5C, or Hite mouthpiece
  - Ligatures: Bonade or Rovner
- ♦ Plastic Reed Holder Holds 4 reeds
- <u>Clear</u> mouthpiece patches
- Cork Grease, Silk Cleaning Swab & Cleaning Cloth

### SAXOPHONES:

- ♦ Three Four working reeds (Vandoren) at all times. (NOTE: Reed Option on right column)
  - o 6th grade 2½ strength
  - o  $7^{\text{th}}/8^{\text{th}}$  grade  $2\frac{1}{2}$  or 3 strength
- ♦ Mouthpiece: Hite, Yamaha 5C, Rousseau (5R facing) or Selmer C\* mouthpiece
- ♦ Ligature: Rovner or Bonade
- Plastic Reed Holder Holds 4 reeds
- <u>Clear</u> mouthpiece patches
- ♦ Neck Strap
- ♦ Cork Grease, Silk Cleaning Swab & Cleaning Cloth

### TRUMPETS, FRENCH HORNS, BARITONES, AND TUBAS

Mouthpiece (Mouthpieces are not included with school instrument rentals)
 Trumpet: Bach/Blessing 5C or 3C mouthpiece (Not a 7C)

French Horn: Blessing 11, Farkus MDC, Conn H2, or Schilke 30 mouthpiece

Baritone: Bach 6 1/2AL small shank mouthpiece or Schilke 51

Tuba: Conn Helleberg 7B or 120s mouthpiece

- Valve oil & Slide grease
- Polishing Cloth, Mouthpiece Brush & Cleaning Snake

### TROMBONES:

Mouthpiece

Bach 6 1/2AL small shank mouthpiece or Schilke 51

- ♦ Mouthpiece Brush, Polishing Cloth & Cleaning Snake
- Slide Cream Slide-o-Mix (for slide lubrication)
- Small spray bottle with water

It is strongly suggested that students who play instruments requiring reeds to buy reeds by the box. This is much more economical and convenient than running to the store every time one breaks (and they WILL break.... frequently.)

### REED Option:

You can purchase a Loree Plastic Reed for Clarinet and Saxophone that will work for beginners. This reed will last longer and not break nearly as easy.

Advanced wind instrument players are also encouraged to obtain step-up mouthpieces for their instruments. Such mouthpieces will show great improvement in the quality of sound produced by the students, and is an appealing option when compared to the cost of purchasing a new instrument. A beginner instrument will often sound very similar to a professional model when outfitted with a step-up mouthpiece. Step-up mouthpieces are listed by instrument. If you are interested in purchasing a more advanced instrument, Mr. Wilson can assist you with more information. Please call ahead to be certain your items are in stock before making a trip to the store. Please note: When more advanced instruments are purchased, the beginner model should be kept for later use in marching band.

# REQUIRED EQUIPMENT FOR EPMS PERCUSSIONISTS

- Set of Bells & Snare Drum These will be kept at home for home practice unless instructed to be brought to school.
  Percussionists will play all percussion instruments including mallets, timpani, snare, cymbals, "toys", etc. No one will play only snare.
  We will create well-rounded percussionists, not drummers.
- Sticks and mallets of various types: Just as woodwind and brass players rent an instrument, purchase upgraded instruments, replace reeds and/or upgrade their mouthpieces, percussionists use a variety of types of instrument that use a variety of types of mallets and sticks. A list of equipment needed to build a standard stick bag is below.
- A school equipment usage fee will be assessed to each percussionist for the use of classroom equipment. This fee will help to maintain the instruments used in the classroom or will be put towards the purchase of new equipment. The fee is \$50.00 for the year.
